

4-7-8 Breathing Exercise

This is a **quick and easy** way to de-stress. Sit comfortably, feet on the floor. Tongue against the roof of your mouth.

- 1. Inhale through your mouth for a count of 4
- 2. Hold your breath for a count of 7
- Slowly exhale through your mouth for a count of 8
- 4. Repeat this sequence 3 more times

You can do this exercise as often as you wish. Use it whenever you **feel stressed**, **anxious**, **panicked or to help you fall asleep**.




