

The planning meeting was a success! Irene Bembry, Director of Programs transformed the dull library space into a beautifully decorated meeting space. Members eagerly volunteered for roles in the holiday play and for roles on the February Fundraiser roster. Additionally, members proposed the following goals for the rest of the 2019-2020 fiscal year:

- 1.Stay aligned with AAUW goals by piquing an interest in math, science, and technology in middle school girls.
- A. Donate the cost of a full week of Tech Trek camp to two campers by May 30th.
- B. Continue to nominate at least two girls from the Tampa area for Tech Trek

camp by camp deadline.

Continue to offer two \$1,000 scholarships to USF upper-class STEM students.

- 2. Participate in the National AAUW Gold Star program.
 - A. Retain at least 90% of members and submit dues by September 30th
 - B. Hold and event/training seminar in FY 20 open to the public.
- 3. Participate in the Black Women Economic Security Research Project.
 - A. Apply for research grant.
 - B. Identify a research representative from Tampa.
 - C. Identify a person in community to be interviewed for research.
- 4.Increase fundraiser revenue by at least 10% in FY 20.
- A. At least 60% of members will purchase at least two tickets to the February fundraiser or donate a \$100.00.
- B. Conduct at least two smaller fundraisers, one to complete by November general meeting and one to complete by April general meeting.
- 5. Address Tampa's sustainability through succession planning.
- A. Each board director will identify at least one other member to work in a mentorship role by January 2020
 - B. Fill Vice President role by April 2020.
 - C. Fill Incoming President's role by April 2020.
