The next occupant of this space is Dr. Saundra Johnson Austin. She is no stranger to AAUW. Her first encounter was as a 2004-2005 Selected Professions Fellowship recipient for her master's degree in Business Administration from the Univer-

sity of Notre Dame. At our Tampa Branch ,she served on the 2019-2020 TechTrek committee under the leadership of Dr. Gloria Hilton.



As a child, she recalls her parents instilling in her the value of an education. Her career modeled after her father working in construction and her mother as an elementary school special education teacher. Hence the reason she earned a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from The Pennsylvania State University and a Doctor of Education from the University of Southern California in organizational change and leadership. The title of her dissertation is "The Challenges Teachers Face Imple-

menting Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Curricula, An Evaluation Study."

Dr. Johnson Austin is the project coordinator for the Florida Alliance for Graduate Education and the Professoriate (AGEP) at the university of South Florida. She also teaches 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade girls and boys at Academy Prep Center of Tampa. In 2007 she founded Charis Consulting Group, LLC as the President and CEO. Formerly, she was the executive director of Curated PathwaysTM to Innovation, senior vice president for operations at the National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering, Inc., president and CEO of St. Michael's High School, executive vice president of the Community Partnership for Lifelong Learning, executive director of the National Consortium for Graduate Degrees for Minorities in Engineering and Science (GEM), and Minority Engineering Program director at The Pennsylvania State University. She began her career at Bechtel Power Corporation as a cost engineer.

Dr. Johnson Austin is an innovative leader, researcher, and public speaker. She has published several professional articles addressing the broadening the participation of students of color in STEM education and careers. She is known for her ability to influence and focus on building expert teams, incorporating community development, marketing and communications outreach, and education policy. "We must become the change we want to see" (M. Gandhi) is her approach to life.

She is an active member of: the American Association of University Women; member-at-large for the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) Minorities in Engineering Division (MIND), vice president of the Coalition of Hispanic African and Native Americans for the Next Generation of Engineers and Scientists (CHANGES); education committee consultant for the Caribbean Community Association; and member of the United States White House endorsed initiative Algebra by 7th Grade, which was established under the Obama administration. 1998, she was awarded the National Society of Black Engineers' Inaugural Golden Torch Award for Minority Engineering Program Director of the Year and Outstanding Contribution by a Minority Engineering Program Administrator Award by the National Association of Multicultural Engineering Program Advocates. In April 2015, she was recognized by The Pennsylvania State University as Outstanding Engineering Alumnus for Civil and Environmental Engineering and she currently serves on the College of Engineering's Industrial and Professional Advisory Council.

Dr. Johnson Austin is married to Rev. Clyde L. Austin, Jr. She is stepmother to Joshua and Charity. She enjoys volunteering her time to mentor girls, college students, and early professionals on the opportunities in STEM education and careers. Her skills are sure to be a critical asset throughout her tenure as president of Tampa AAUW.
