Actions that will be taken to enhance the safety level of the event:

- 1. All attendees will be strongly encouraged to wear a mask when not speaking, performing, or eating.
- 2. Tables will be spaced to enhance safety. No more than 6 attendees will be assigned to a table designed for 8.



Tips for Inviting guests to AAUW...

 Know what you are going to say. Have a simple script in mind. You can use 	
something like the following:	
Hi What are you doing on I would love to invite you as my guest to	an

Club. AAUW is an organization that empowers and uplifts women. We usually ha	ve
guest speakers on different topics. I would love it if you could join me.	

2. Be Excited:

People can hear excitement in your voice. The more excited you are about something, the more likely someone would be willing to join you.

3. Make the invitation personal. Invite in person or over the phone. It's more personal than a text or an email. It is so much easier to say no over email or text.

4. Keep it Simple:

Don't overcomplicate the invitation. Ensure you explain, what, where, when, and what time.

5. **Invite and then follow-up:** People forget, so follow-up the week of the meeting, letting the person know how excited you will be to have them as your guest. Let them know they can also invite a friend if they want.


- 5. A tag, listing basket contents, will be attached to each basket to prevent potential ticket buyers from manipulating a basket to determine its contents.
- 6. Potential auction bidders will be required to use gloves or hand sanitizer (provided) prior to touching or handling auction items.
- 7. Auction item donors will be asked to ensure all donated items are clean as well as attractive, in good repair, and usable. Auction items will need to be assessed by a member of the Program Committee before the item can be accepted.
- 8. All members and guests will be asked to help optimize the level of safety at the event by refraining from attending if he/she has a fever or other symptoms of the flu or COVID.

Intention to submit an auction item or prepare a basket for drawings, must be confirmed by February 19, 2022. Please bring proposed auction items to the January 15th or *February 19th general Tampa AAUW meeting to have the item assessed.
