
World Day of Social Justice: February 20

Together We Can Make A Difference!

World Day of Social Justice is observed annually on February 20. Internationally, the world is plagued with unfortunate issues that prohibit millions of individuals from living a fair life. Many of the world's population, through no fault of their own, are deprived of basic facilities, such as homes, jobs, healthcare, education, nutrition, equality and more. It must be the responsibility of the privileged to ensure that we can create a just world where social justice is a norm.



At our general meeting on February 18, in observance of World Social Justice Day, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Committee will host a panel discussion on "The Critical Race Theory: Its Impact on Social Justice." The panel will be comprised of three dynamic panelists:



- **Dr. Idella Phillips**, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Officer and past President, Hillsborough County League of Women Voters
- **Dr. Vonzell Agosto**, Professor of Educational Leadership and Policy Studies, Affiliate Faculty in Women and Gender Studies, and Educational Measurement and Research, University of South Florida
- **Dr. Dana Thompson Dorsey**, Professor, College of Education, University of South Florida

While we are excited to hear from our panelist, each of us can personally observe World Day of Social Justice as well. The DEI committee suggests we can:

1. Advocate for a social cause: Research and advocate for a cause such as gender equity.
2. Organize a social justice event: Start an event in your neighborhood to raise awareness and help create a fair world for everyone.
3. Educate ourselves on social issues: Read books, conversate with affected groups, or travel around the world to see the conditions in other countries.

Annual elections are upcoming. There are several board positions which will soon become available. Over the next few months you will be able to nominate and vote on nominees to fill the positions with the final selections being announced during the April 4th meeting. At the close of the January 21st meeting, the board members in attendance voted and approved the 2023 Elections Committee members including Paula Stewart, Rev. Martha Vaguener and Catherine Clark Martin (will serve as Chair).

Available Board Positions and Position Descriptions

<p>Vice President</p> <p>This position works very closely with the President and supports his or her agendas and duties. The Vice-President will perform the duties of the President when he or she is absent. As a branch leader, this position provides you the opportunity to understand AAUW in a deeper way and help move the Tampa's branch in a continued positive direction.</p>	<p>Director of Program Development</p> <p>Foster your creativity in this role! This position, along with the committee members create the wonderful programs that we have come to enjoy at the Tampa branch. The Director will oversee the planning, development, and implementation of those programs, as well as selecting and presenting an appropriate gift for the outgoing president.</p>
<p>Director of Membership</p> <p>This position focuses not only on recruitment of new members to our branch, but also in retention of our current members. You will keep record of all new members and will facilitate their introduction at their first meeting. The Director of Membership works very closely with the Corresponding Secretary and Director of Communications when the member joins.</p>	<p>Director of Finance</p> <p>Do you enjoy numbers? This position may be for you. Working closely with the President and Recording Secretary, this role pays financial obligations, keeps detailed finance records, maintains the bank account, shares financial reports at meetings and during formal reviews, collects annual dues, pays out scholarships, and submits applications to AAUW National.</p>
<p>Director of Public Policy</p> <p>AAUW policies ensure actions are congruent with issues that impact women and girls. The incumbent reviews the AAUW website and other reliable sources to share info with members and recruits committee members to help create an annual public policy program that reflects local, state, or national public policy issues that affect women and girls.</p>	<p>Recording Secretary</p> <p>You will be recording the history of AAUW Tampa by recording and maintaining records of the general branch and board meetings. The Recording Secretary shall assist the President or the President's representative at each meeting. The recording secretary shall sit on an appointed bylaws ad hoc committee to record meeting minutes.</p>
<p>Parliamentarian</p> <p>Rule enforcement is another way of characterizing this position. The Parliamentarian shall utilize the Affiliate's bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised 12th edition, to ensure parliamentary procedure is followed. The person in this role will advise the branch president, officers, committees, and members of parliamentary rules and matters of procedure. The parliamentarian will act as a facilitator and educator to membership and establish that a quorum is present for meetings where votes are taken. This position is an appointed position.</p>

They earned the highest score for the “Table Talk” activity which was designed as a fun way to review three major topics covered in previous presentations or the AAUW Tampa newsletter. The “Table Talk” activity quizzed participants on the following topics/events:

- *The International Day of the Girl Child*, which increased awareness of equity in rights, education, and health of young girls across the globe (presented by Tara Perkins in the form of a lovely tea fundraiser during the October 2022 meeting)
- *Shared Governance*, which highlighted the importance of executives and members within a group using non-hierarchical approaches to create and maintain an environment where the beliefs, concerns, and ideas of all members matter (presented by Dr. Bert Dunbar in the forms of two very thoughtful essays which appeared in the October 2022 and November 2022 newsletters)
- *Human Trafficking*, which brought attention to how we all can become aware of and participate in the process of stopping human trafficking in our communities (presented by attorneys Jenay Iurata and Brent Woody in the form of a dynamic in-person presentation which anchored the monthly meeting in November 2022)

Kudos to Avis, John, Catherine, and Pat, the quick-minded quartet, for showing us all that knowledge matters. To reward their great efforts, members of the winning table earned a “free lunch,” courtesy of the Tampa AAUW, Inc. member’s incentive fund. Monies in the fund were donated specifically for membership incentive activities.

Applauding the Scholarship Committee

For their diligence in selecting the 2022 scholarship recipients, we give commendations to the Scholarship Committee, consisting of Irene Bembry, Connie Fountain, Kim Rostick, Jackie Vento and Dr. Gloria Hilton. Emily C., Jasmine R., and Julia R., each studying a form of engineering at the University of South Florida in Tampa, were the selected recipients of the financial scholarship awarded by AAUW Tampa, Inc.



During the January 2023 monthly meeting, the trio of recipients participated in an introspective Q&A session and eloquently discussed perspectives on a) their academic journeys as female STEM majors, b) how they benefitted from being awarded AAUW scholarships, c) the need for seeking mentorship within the field, d) the importance of securing internships that align with their future academic and career plans following graduation, and e) the awesome feat of graduating from college debt-free. The students’ stories were engaging and highlighted the complexities within their majors and the realities that there is continued work needed in promoting women in STEM-focused majors as each student reported only having 2-3 female faculty (out of 30) during their academic program. 


