

AAUW Celebrates the Passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act

AAUW Chief Executive Officer Gloria L. Blackwell issued this statement on the passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, passed as an amendment to the omnibus spending package. President Biden signed this critical bill into law on December 29, 2022.

"We are thrilled to end this year with a long-awaited moment: AAUW applauds the passage of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (PWFA), a momentous victory for pregnant and postpartum workers and their families, health, and economic security.

AAUW believes no worker should be forced to choose between their health and their livelihood. But many people who are pregnant have risked being forced out of the workplace simply for following their doctors' orders. The PWFA now requires employers to provide basic accommodations to protect workers' ability to provide for themselves and their families without compromising their health or pregnancies. This is the most significant protection for pregnant workers in decades, and comes at a time when women in the workforce—particularly in frontline and low-wage jobs—acutely need it most.

As we celebrate this important win for our mission fighting for workplace equity, we also extend enormous gratitude to everyone who worked so hard to make the PWFA law. Over the past 10 years, thousands of AAUW members and activists mobilized for this critical legislation, joined by our allies and partner organizations in tireless grassroots efforts across the country. We also thank each member of Congress who voted to pass the PWFA and for taking a stand to support a safer future for all pregnant and postpartum workers in the United States."


The Books We Loved Most: 2022 Edition

Start a Memory Jar




A great way to capture memories and to get the family involved are memory jars, simple mason jars in which family members deposit memories for the year. A member of the family will:

- Take a small slip of paper and write down personal memories which are fun, impactful, or significant.
- Drop the memories into jar and save them up all year long.
- When the end of the year comes, the family reads the memories together.

Create a Photo Calendar

Cell phones make it easier than ever to snap tons of photos. A cool way to put them to use is to create a photo calendar. Each month:





- At the end of the year, have a photo calendar made (or make your own) for next year, pairing the past photos of the month to the month of the following year.
- This way in the next year you can recall the fond memories that happened in the previous year.

Start a Blog



Similar to keeping a journal, a blog is an excellent way to capture memories. You can create entries every day, week or as often as you'd like. As a reminder, blogs are

helpful because:

- You can upload all kinds of media (photos, audio clips, video, writings) to help capture a moment
- You don't necessarily have to be techsavvy to get started either. Services like WordPress make it very easy to create and maintain simple blog sites.
- Blogs can be password protected so that only those who you share it with can view the blog.

Make Memory Crafts

There are hundreds of ways to capture a memory in a craft and to make every moment special. The only true limitations are one's own imagination. Almost anything can be used as a memory craft including:



- Capturing the memories using personal artifacts
- Designing memory items that are capable of opening and closing for storing items inside.
- Making shadow boxes with interesting outer decorations which can be filled with special memorabilia collected during the year.
