She has dedicated herself to assisting human trafficking survivors and is an enthusiastic human rights advocate. She has provided pro bono assistance to human trafficking survivors in over 200 cases. Additionally, she has

received numerous awards and appointments recognizing her commitment and dedication to her work.

Attorney Iurato will grab your attention immediately with her down-to-earth presentation style, subject knowledge, and reports of work she and her colleagues have done in the field. She will share human trafficking background information, prevalence, public policy, ways to recognize a possible human trafficking situation, and practical ways in which organizations and or individuals can help attack this disgraceful problem. Attorney Iurato will present a powerful presentation that you, your neighbors, teenagers, college students teachers, social workers, counselors, and parents would benefit from hearing.

Knowledge Matters

Shared Governance: Putting it into Practice

In the October newsletter, an overview of shared governance was discussed, including a definition of shared governance and a description of leadership and membership responsibilities. Just to recap, shared governance exists when everyone has a voice and a vote. Most members probably did not join AAUW because of its governance structure. However, the governance structure of an organization may contribute to derailing or enhancing the organization s goals. Governance structure dictates how financial and operational decisions are made. Rigid top-down governance, can effectively inhibit creativity and innovation, and leave large numbers of people disengaged, thereby perpetuating systems of inequality. Two critical components of shared governance are emotional intelligence and assertiveness.

Oftentimes, more focus is placed on intelligence gained from earning a degree or some other form of education, while little to no focus is lent to emotional intelligence. However, of the two, it is emotional



intelligence that is the most important. Emotional intelligence is effectively managing the many emotions that one may have throughout a given day. Some may think holding their emotions under a cover like withdrawing is the best way to handle emotions and that is the lady or gentleman way to manage emotions, especially anger. Others may think sarcasm, putdowns, or spewing their emotions all over everyone in the form of such behaviors as threats, yelling, or controlling the conversation are effective emotional management tools. However, such approaches are deal breakers when searching for consensus- getting everyone to a conclusion they can live with.

Effective emotional self-management and responding effectively to others means an individual is able to embrace the basic tools of shared governance. Effectively expressing one s ideas, while listening and considering the ideas of others, whether leaders or members, is the crux of emotional intelligence. When emotional self-management is at

stake, giving one-self the message, slow down, breath, think, listen, and analyze will go a long way in getting through the moment.

So, how does assertiveness play a role in shared governance? Assertiveness and emotional intelligence go hand in hand. If one is assertive, he or she is engaging in the skill of saying what she or he thinks and feels while respecting self and others. The process is a two-way street. Exhibiting emotional intelligence and assertive behavior is buying into the understanding that the best ideas may be enhanced when the voice of others is not only heard but is also respected, appreciated, and used to enhance the final project.

- Veterans Day is a federal holiday that is meant to honor all veterans of the uniformed services who served or are still serving during times of peace as well as war.
- Veterans Day has its origins at the end of World War I when at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, the fighting ended with the signing of an armistice.
- A congressional act, approved May 13, 1938, made Nov. 11, a federal holiday.
- In 1954, Congress at the urging of veterans' organizations changed the name to Veterans Day to honor service members who had served in all of the nation's wars.
