Vice President

This position works very closely with the President and supports his or her agendas and duties. The Vice-President will perform the duties of the President when he or she is absent. As a branch leader, this position provides you the opportunity to understand AAUW in a deeper way and help move the Tampa's branch in a continued positive direction.

Director of Membership

This position focuses not only on recruitment of new members to our branch, but also in retention of our current members. You will keep record of all new members and will facilitate their introduction at their first meeting. The Director of Membership works very closely with the Corresponding Secretary and Director of Communications when the member joins.

Director of Public Policy

AAUW policies ensure actions are congruent with issues that impact women and girls. The incumbent reviews the AAUW website and other reliable sources to share info with members and recruits committee members to help create an annual public policy program that reflects local, state, or national public policy issues that affect women and girls.

Director of Program Development

Foster your creativity in this role! This position, along with the committee members create the wonderful programs that we have come to enjoy at the Tampa branch. The Director will oversee the planning, development, and implementation of those programs, as well as selecting and presenting an appropriate gift for the outgoing president.

Director of Finance

Do you enjoy numbers? This position may be for you. Working closely with the President and Recording Secretary, this role pays financial obligations, keeps detailed finance records, maintains the bank account, shares financial reports at meetings and during formal reviews, collects annual dues, pays out scholarships, and submits applications to AAUW National.

Recording Secretary

You will be recording the history of AAUW Tampa by recording and maintaining records of the general branch and board meetings. The Recording Secretary shall assist the President or the President's representative at each meeting. The recording secretary shall sit on an appointed bylaws ad hoc committee to record meeting minutes.

Parliamentarian

Rule enforcement is another way of characterizing this position. The Parliamentarian shall utilize the Affiliate's bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised 12th edition, to ensure parliamentary procedure is followed. The person in this role will advise the branch president, officers, committees, and members of parliamentary rules and matters of procedure. The parliamentarian will act as a facilitator and educator to membership and establish that a quorum is present for meetings where votes are taken. This position is an appointed position.

Facilitated by Dr. Saundra Johnson Austin, guest panelists- Drs. Vonzell Agosto, Joan Holmes-Mosely, and Dana Thompson Dorsey- provided insights on the history and development of the critical race theory (CRT) movement. The movement was conceived and utilized by legal scholars to critique race-based academic, social, and economic iniquities following the reversals of several civil rights advancements.

Panelist asserted CRT continues to be a necessary tool anyone can use in their pursuit to examine and create change in laws, systems and practices that, based solely upon race and power, create different outcomes for black and brown people.

NEW MEMBER SPOTLIGHT




It was over dinner, during a cruise, when Paula Thomas was first introduced to AAUW. Prior to this point, Paula had never heard of AAUW. Fortunately, the woman she was sitting with, was a current member of a different branch who eagerly shared information about the organization. After several conversations, Paula's attention was drawn to AAUW's Focus on STEM and scholarships. She also found value in the organization's focus on education, which Paula describes as an important entity which helps "to change the trajectory of children." Before disembarking from the cruise, Paula exchanged information with her dinner mate and was encouraged to learn more about AAUW.

Unfortunately, soon after, the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 arrived, prompting each of us to take stock of our commitments. Paula, didn't join AAUW right away. In 2020 Paula, who had worked as an educator for 26 years, decided to take an early retirement. Paula's nearly 30-year career presented her with a variety of opportunities within the school system and Hillsborough County. After completing 7 years of employment in customer service and hospitality at the Marriott in Tampa, Paula's career in education began. Her roles included work as a head start substitute and paraprofessional teacher, administrator with the Children's Board of Hillsborough County, and parent advocate and family liaison, fighting for children with emotional disabilities. From 2002 to 2020, Paula worked in Exceptional Student Education,

where her leadership and management responsibilities included taking actions to bridge services from home to school, while also ensuring staffing, training, and professional compliance for employees in a total of 52 schools. Paula's work has also extended to her church, Bible Based Fellowship, where she serves to provide scholarships for students of the congregation.

While working in her role as a liaison and raising her own kids, Paula leaned into her passion for organizational leadership, especially when it came to programs for kids of color. Her desire was to create structures and systems that would improve the practices around Community leaders designating resources for programs and



Subsequently, Paula went on to earn a master's degree in organizational leadership with an emphasis on Ethics from Clermont Lincoln. Using the four key principles of Claremont Lincoln- mindfulness, dialogue, collaboration, and change- Paula developed training and growth services for organizations like Career Source and SCORE Tampa, where she is currently the co-chair.

Through her career, Paula has been a steadfast advocate for children, has ensured organizations are serving ethically, and has continued to share her knowledge within the community. So, it is fortunate she set her attention back towards AAUW in Summer of 2022. After reviewing the cost of membership, researching leadership, reviewing social media pages, and learning more about the scholarship program, Paula decided to join AAUW Tampa, where she has found a place in the scholarship committee and is looking forward to working with strong, competent women.

We are glad to have Paula as a member of AAUW Tampa. When not working or volunteering her time, Paula enjoys spending time with her husband, five children, eleven grandchildren (who call her YaYa), and her French bulldog, Raider.
