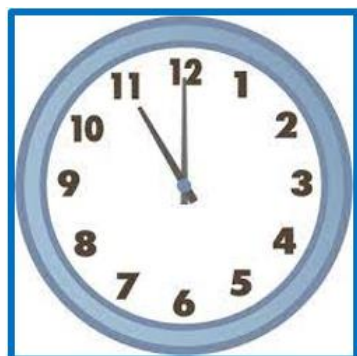

# AAUW TECH TREK SUMMER 2023

As one of only 22 Tech Trek sites across the United States, Tech Trek Florida 2023 is in the books and we are so proud!

## Stats:

- Florida Tech Trek received 185 nominations from 55 different schools across the state and from 89 different teachers across 17 branches.
- 102 girls completed the application process including those all-important personal interviews.
- Thanks again to the stellar AAUW Tampa Branch committee of Bonnie Edis, Dr. Gloria Hilton, Dr. Demetrix Rostick-Owens and Pat Tabone
- All girls who applied were accepted!! Woo Hoo!!
- A total of 82 rising 8th grade girls attended Tech Trek in Florida
- 43 campers at [Stetson University](#) in Deland June 11-17.
- 39 campers at [Florida Atlantic University](#) in Jupiter June 18-24.

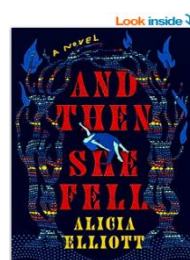
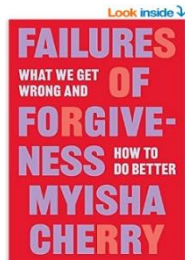
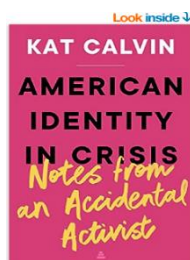
