Please join the AAUW Florida Public Policy Committee for its 2nd education series, Thursday October 5, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. for a presentation on Title IX and Dress Codes in Florida Schools. The guest speaker will be Nancy Tray, Change the Dress Code Movement, St Johns County.

Background: The U.S. Department of Education launched an investigation into a complaint that the St. Johns County School District discriminated against female students through its enforcement of the dress code. This led to the Department of Education, Office of Civil Rights (OCR) investigation into whether the district subjected female students to discrimination on the basis of sex in connection with enforcing dress code requirements, in violation of Title IX, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs or activities.


