 In efforts to sustain AAUW, the National AAUW Board of Directors will be voting to change membership dues in December. The first change would increase college/university dues from \$175 to \$250, which has not changed in years. The second proposed change is to reallocate the \$3 action fund to AAUW, Inc., making national dues \$72.00 for individual membership and fully tax deductible. 

The mission of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) is to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education and advocacy.

Tech Trek, part of our education focus, is a week-long summer STEM camp scholarship valued at \$1,200. Through hands-on problem solving and encounters with women role models in science, technology, engineering, and math, AAUW Tech Trek helps girls see their futures while having nonstop fun. This one-week summer camp is backed by AAUW's research and designed to make STEM fields exciting and accessible to girls in middle school — the age when girls' participation in these fields statistically drops. For many girls, the week-long camp sparks their curiosity and places them on a path toward success.

Math and science teachers, using the link at the top of the page, please consider nominating up to five (5) current 7th grade girls to represent your school for AAUW Florida Tech Trek, taking place in June 2024.

You can read about this year's <u>Florida Tech Trek</u> STEM classes, learn about our record setting 15 Hillsborough County scholarship recipients in the AAUW Tampa Branch <u>September newsletter</u> (pg. 6-7) and view photos from the Tech Trek presentation in our <u>October newsletter</u> (pg. 11).

Ideally, we're looking for students who: have displayed an interest in STEM, could benefit from a mentorship program, will follow through with family application completion and who might not otherwise be able attend an overnight camp.


Math and science teacher nominations will be accepted November 1 - December 15. I am happy to answer any questions you might have.

AAUW Florida Lobby Days are January 16 and 17 in Tallahassee Get Ready for our Opportunity to be Heard!

AAUW Florida Lobby Days are our opportunity to observe and take part in the legislative process and to influence it in the direction of equity, especially for women and girls. AAUW Florida offers significant monetary assistance to those willing to travel to Tallahassee, which not every comparable organization does, but it does represent a financial commitment for those participating.

However, this is one of the most important things we do as a state AAUW affiliate and is prescribed in our policies. Legislators, including Rep. Anna Eskamani who spoke with us on the November 16 Public Policy Issues Forum, tell us that being present in Tallahassee to advocate for our priorities is very important.

- Half the room cost of \$120 will be subsidized by AAUW Florida, so with a roommate there would be no cost for the participant for lodging.
- We will offer a small allowance for travel for the driver. Please try to share. Meals including one group meal are on one's own.



- Activities during Lobby Days will include a group dinner on Tuesday evening and meetings with legislators who support our priorities. We want to thank and encourage them! Please arrange a meeting with your own legislator(s) during our time at the capitol whenever you can.
- You will be provided with position papers to leave behind and talking points on the bills the Public Policy Committee has identified to support or oppose.

We encourage branches to plan to visit your local legislators during the weeks leading up to the 2024 legislative session. Free weeks are: December 18-22, 2023, and January 1-5, 2024

In addition, please consider approaching legislators who may not usually be supportive, asking them questions about our areas of concern such as pay equity and personal control of health care.

Florida Highwaymen Exhibit

The Highwaymen Artist are having a showing at the G. Carter Woodson African American Museum in St. Petersburg, Florida. These artists, consisting of 25 men and 1 woman, traveled around Florida selling their landscape paintings out of their cars during the segregated 1950 and 60s. They sold their paintings to hotels on the coast. The cost was a few dollars. Today, the prices are in the thousands.

Collectively the painters are known to as the Highwaymen.
