

Now shifting back to Women's History Month. Making up 50.4% of the population, women have been credited for creating practical items for moms such as reusable covers for diapers (attributed to Marion Donovan), designing safety commodities for homeowners with more technologically driven products such as the video home security system (attributed to Marie Van Brittan Brown), and contributing to the discovery of HeLa Cells through one's personal cancer cells



(attributed to Henrietta Lacks). The span of contributions to our society by women is truly infinite and this is why we celebrate!



Though I am aware of Women's History Month, I have never taken the time to learn about the origins. According to The National WWII Museum of New Orleans, Women's History Month was facilitated by the direct actions and perseverance of women from the National Women's History Association (NWHA). As an output of their dedication to "preserving women's history," in 1987, members of NWHA petitioned Congress to set aside a month to commemorate the history of women and their accompanying contributions. After

Congress passed legislation, the first Women's History Month was acknowledged in 1987.

Three things stand out for me after learning more about this month. The first is- the catalyst for change is dedication to your mission. The second is, dedication + action are needed to foster change. The third is- sustained change persists only through our perseverance and commitment to advancing the mission through collective and focused actions. Without all three, the desired output of sustained change is impossible. As we have seen over the past month, our organization has had to face hard truths about how we will persist.

As you will read in the March 2024 President's Message, knowing that it "takes all of us to run a successful branch" ... in the last month, thankfully, through many conversations and honest talks, several members of AAUW Tampa have embraced the call for continued and sustainable internal organizational change and have "stepped up to the call and put" their "names into the running for the upcoming elections." This was a necessary action to ensure the sustainability of our organization! However, this is only one step! The remaining steps will

come as new and returning AAUW Tampa members remember why <u>WE</u> are dedicated to the mission, how <u>WE</u> can combine <u>OUR</u> dedication with purposeful action, and ultimately, how we continue to contribute to the sustainability of <u>OUR</u> organization. This Women's History Month, I challenge all members to remain dedicated to the mission, to put in the work and take actions to move us forward and persist and persevere even when things look bleak. 

<u>Critical Need for Volunteers and</u> Mentors for Children in Foster Care

The Florida Guardian ad Litem Office represents abused, abandoned, and neglected children in court and the community. Through the collaboration of a multi-disciplinary team that always includes a Guardian ad Litem Attorney, a child welfare professional, and hopefully a trained volunteer or pro bono attorney from the child's community, if one is available, our team provides quality, independent legal representation for Florida's most vulnerable children while assisting the child in expressing their needs and wishes. Our unique approach allows us to support the whole child, addressing their physical, educational, mental, emotional, social, and legal needs. We need more community volunteers and mentors for the children we represent.

What is a Guardian ad Litem Volunteer? A Guardian ad Litem Volunteer is a team member that collaborates to provide proactive, child-centered advocacy for children in foster care. Currently, there are more than 2,500 abused, abandoned, and neglected children in Hillsborough County who are the subject of dependency proceedings. When you join our Florida Guardian ad Litem Office Team, you positively impact a child's life. No experience is needed, and training is free.

What is a Mentor? Our Hope Florida – A Pathway to Promise mentors help youth aging out of the foster care system, many with nobody to turn to. Youth are partnered with a mentor who will serve as a committed, caring adult as the youth transitions to adulthood, providing a lifeline for questions and advice related to living independently. It is easy to become a Mentor; training is online, self-paced and free.

Interviews have concluded for the five students who submitted applications for Tech Trek. The Tech Trek Chair, Kim Rostick, extends a huge thanks to the Tech Trek Committee made up of Rukmini Potdar, Dee Owens, and Pat Tabone who coordinated communication and Zoom interviews with parents and students. Those students have now been ranked and



sent to Tech Trek Florida who will make final decisions by March 30th on campers at the two one-week camps in June. If these talented and enthusiastic students are any indication, the future of women in STEM is bright! We look forward to making official announcements in the April newsletter.

For most students this will be a summer of firsts: first sleepaway camp, first time on a college campus, first STEM immersion, first time meeting cohorts from across the state of Florida, first time being mentored and challenged to develop their skills in STEM, first time having roommates and building relationships with others outside the home, a first taste of independence

(within boundaries). Families are asked to pay a \$50 registration fee. AAUW Tampa Branch pays \$1,200 per camper for this priceless life changing adventure. We need your help to raise more funds. If 12 AAUW Tampa Branch members contribute \$100 each, it will fund one student's priceless experience. We realize that is a big ask for some.
