PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear AAUW Members,

As we honor Black History Month, I want to take a moment to reflect on the profound contributions and enduring legacy African Americans throughout our nation's history. This month serves as a crucial reminder of the resilience, creativity, and strength that have shaped our country and continue to inspire.

African Americans have made an indelible impact on shaping America across numerous fields, from science and technology to culture and social justice. During Black History Month, it's important to recognize and celebrate these contributions, as they have been pivotal in the progress and development of our society. Read on to see the impacts!

Inventors and Innovators:

African American inventors have changed the face of science and technology with their groundbreaking work. As stated in her email, we are at a critical moment in time that may test one's personal values and more broadly adversely impact women's economic equity. She highlighted the following significant challenges:

 Our reality: Across the nation, laws and policies hinder equal access to quality education. From budget cuts to legislative rollbacks, the road ahead is tough.

 Our resolve: Our efforts to advance women's economic security through higher education remain critical. The progress we've made is at risk — and we must be vigilant in fighting back.

 Our advocacy: We are ramping up our efforts to influence policy surrounding enforcement of Title IX civil rights protections and supporting essential college-access programs.

 Our support: Our Fellowships & Grants programs will continue to support women scholars globally.

 Our community: We will strengthen our network to create a united front for change.

What does this all mean? It means that we can't give up; we have to keep doing the work based on our mission "to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy." As Margaret Mead wisely said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has."
